History of Queen Elizabeth II

Queen Elizabeth II was born Princess Elizabeth Alexandra Mary on April 21, 1926 in London. At the time of her birth, no one thought Elizabeth would someday become queen.

In 1936, the course of Elizabeth's life changed with the death of her grandfather, King George V. Her uncle became King Edward VIII, but he only ruled for six months. King Edward was in love with American divorcee Wallis Simpson, and had to choose between her and the crown. In the end, Edward chose Simpson and Elizabeth's father, Prince Albert, became King George VI.

Elizabeth married Philip Mountbatten, Duke of Edinburgh in 1947 and became queen on February 6, 1952, and was crowned on June 2, 1953. In her new role, Queen Elizabeth II had new political duties. She held weekly meetings with the country's prime minister, starting with Winston Churchill and every leader after him.

Elizabeth has modernized the monarchy as well. She had dropped some of its formalities and made some of the sites and treasures more accessible to the public.

Now in her eighties, Elizabeth has remained steadfastly on the throne and this summer celebrated her Diamond Jubilee.
